

Most of our educational systems are built around the notion that thinking and learning takes place inside the head. And yet learners are so much more than their brains; they have bodies that feel and move, they are embedded in physical environments, and they interact with others in a network of relationships. This is the Elephant in The Room that we've been ignoring: All these outside-the-brain resources that are so ripe for cultivation.

Annie Murphy Paul is the author of "The Extended Mind: The Power of Thinking Outside the Brain", and of "Origins", an investigation of how life in the womb shapes who we become. Now a senior writer at the podcast and radio program "Hidden Brain", Annie's 2011 TED Talk has been viewed by more than 2.8 million people.

Educators, leadership teams, schools and systems are overloaded and exhausted. Collectively, we're stuck in a relentless "additive cycle" with an always expanding number of commitments, programs and initiatives. But what if the way to address the work overload Elephant in The Room lies in doing less? This keynote explores the case for strategic subtraction.

Dr Simon Breakspear develops frameworks and tools that make evidence-based ideas actionable. Over the last decade, he's worked with over 100,000 educators across four continents, and advised governments on how to harness research evidence to create sustainable change. Simon is a former high school teacher and co-author of the book "Teaching Sprints: How overloaded educators can keep getting better".


