Thompson Morrison

Thompson co-authored 'The Dayton Experiment', a book that tells the story of a five-year journey of reimagining the learning culture of a small rural school in Dayton, Oregon. A software executive deeply versed in the fast, iterative learning cycles that underpin Agile methodologies, Thompson's partnership with school principal Jami Fluke ignited student learning beyond anyone's expectations. From that experience, a learning framework called Designed InGenuity (DiG), has now been introduced to hundreds of educators around the world, helping to inspire the transformation of schools on five continents.

David is the Director of Professional Learning at the Queensland Association of State School Principals and has enjoyed a diverse career in educational leadership in a variety of school contexts. His passion for professional learning has seen him work nationally, internationally and in leadership roles in the tertiary sector. David's exposure to Agile has challenged his thinking about learning, sparked his interest in the leadership mindsets necessary for a rapidly changing world and how education can unleash the creative potential in all learners, especially school leaders.


